#### A Clean Heat Standard as the Next Step

- 2008 Global Warming Solutions Act
- 2008 Green Communities Act
- 2021 Next Generation Climate Law
- 2022 Clean Energy & Climate Plan
- Commission on Clean Heat
- Goal: Convert all fossil-fueled homes and businesses to electric heat pumps.



- MEMA has been tracking a potential CHS since it was first proposed in late 2020 in former Gov. Baker's Interim Clean Energy & Climate Plan (CECP).
- The CHS was cited in Baker's final 2022
   CECP.
- 2022 **Commission on Clean Heat Final Report** cites a CHS as a pathway for reducing carbon emissions in the thermal sector.
- Charlie Uglietto chaired the Commission's work group on the CHS, but his group recommended a different framework for a CHS versus MassDEP's current framework.

- MEMA has been fully engaged in this priority issue since MassDEP issued discussion documents in April.
- Total of 6 lobbyists working on the CHS:
- Michael Ferrante: MEMA-MA
- ❖ Bob White: MEMA-MA contract lobbyist
- Steve Dodge: Clean Fuels Alliance of America
- Two lobbyists employed by two MEMA Board members
- ❖ Bill Malloy: Propane Gas Association of NE

- Rallied the industry to issue written comments to MassDEP on CHS "discussion" documents back in April.
- Participated in all virtual MassDEP meetings on the CHS.
- **Testified before state lawmakers** on the elements of a CHS and separate CHS legislation.
- Using Voter Voice & Project Carbon
   Freedom to educate lawmakers and heating oil and propane customers on a CHS.
- Met twice with Governor Maura Healey to voice industry concerns.
- Met with Lt. Governor Kim Driscoll.

- Steve Dodge spoke with Energy & Environmental Secretary Rebecca Tepper to voice concerns.
- Wholesalers Global & Sprague have been fully engaged.
- Met with Beacon Hill lawmakers on the CHS including Senate President Karen Spilka (D), House Majority Leader Michael Moran (D), Senate Minority Leader Bruce Tarr (R), Senator William Brownsberger (D), and Senator Patrick O'Connor (R).
- Letter sent to MassDEP on 8/30/23 signed by all MEMA Board members.
- Letter sent to MassDEP by 4 former members of Commission on Clean Heat.

#### Key Concerns: Clean Heat Standard

- Possible mandate on reducing customer base by 3% annually
- Retail & wholesale fuel supply reporting requirements
- Securing & expanding biodiesel/biofuel feedstock eligibility
- **Scoring** the carbon intensity of fuels
- Scoring the electric grid
- The GREET model
- Credit structure: LCFS or "yardstick"



Awaiting **straw proposal** of the Clean Heat Standard regulation from MassDEP.

Ongoing legislative activity.
